The 2002 Roger E. Joseph Prize, presented to Chaplain Mychal Judge, of blessed memory, and the City of New York Fire Department by Ellen Joseph, Linda Karshan, and Roxanne Leopold and accepted by Fire Chief Daniel Nigro and Father Christopher Keenan of the City of New York Fire Department. Chief Nigro remembered: "On the morning of September 11th, when Chaplain Mychal Judge was

told of the tragedy in progress, he, without hesitation, rushed to the scene and into the lobby of the North Tower. He knew that the firefighters entering would need the comfort of his presence... The real, physical evil that murdered innocents on September 11th, that continues to murder the innocent with suicide bombers cannot be met and cannot be defeated by our hopes, our desires, or even by the best of our prayers. The physical presence of evil must be met by the physical presence of good. Father Judge understood these things on that terrible morning. He acted as he had throughout his life, ministering without fear. He served our firefighters that morning as he served all of his constituencies – with great love, with great compassion, and as a man of God."
