Founded in Cincinnati in 1875, Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion is the oldest institution of higher Jewish education in the western hemisphere and the academic and professional leadership development center of the Reform Movement. The College-Institute prepares rabbis, cantors, educators, and Jewish communal workers at its four campuses in Cincinnati, New York, Los Angeles, and Jerusalem. In addition to training professional leadership to serve the Jewish community, HUC-JIR's School of Graduate Studies, located on the Cincinnati campus, awards masters and doctoral degrees to men and women of all faiths.

The Cincinnati campus is situated adjacent to the University of Cincinnati. Included among the treasures of the campus are the Skirball Museum, housing Jewish ceremonial and ritual objects focusing on immigration, American Judaism, the Torah, Jewish life cycles and festivals, and the Holocaust; the HUC-UC Center for the Study of Ethics and Contemporary Moral Problems, a national resource center for the exploration of critical ethical and moral issues; The Center for Holocaust and Humanity Education, a resource center focusing on the Holocaust and tolerance education; the Archaeology Center, a permanent collection of archaeological artifacts in an interactive learning environment; the Klau Library, Cincinnati, one of the most significant Judaica and Hebraica libraries of the world; the Dalsheimer Rare Book Building housing illuminated manuscripts, Biblical codices, communal records, legal documents, scientific tracts, and the Eduard Birnbaum Collection of Musical Manuscripts; and The Jacob Rader Marcus Center of the American Jewish Archives, a major center of study, research, and publications preserving over twenty million pages of documentation recording the history of Jews in the Western Hemisphere.

As we kick off the 350th anniversary celebration of Jewish Life in America, we commemorate the American ideals of freedom, justice, equality, and pluralism that have allowed Jews to participate fully in the nation's economic, political, and cultural life. Together, we will recount the history of the Jewish community in America and celebrate the achievements of American Jews and the Jewish community over the past 350 years.

The Klau Library, Cincinnati

Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion's Klau Library, Cincinnati is one of the most extensive Jewish libraries in the world. With more than 440,000 printed items of Judaica and Hebraica, it is the second largest collection in the world—second only to the Jewish National and University Library in Jerusalem. The Klau Library is an internationally renowned repository for both rare and contemporary materials in the areas of history, philosophy, religion, the arts, music, literature, and language.

The Jacob Rader Marcus Center of the American Jewish Archives

The Jacob Rader Marcus Center of the American Jewish Archives (AJA) is committed to preserving a documentary heritage of the religious, organizational, economic, cultural, personal, social, and family life of American Jewry. The late Dr. Jacob Rader Marcus founded the AJA in 1947 in the aftermath of World War II and the Holocaust. It was created at a time when the Jews of America faced the awesome responsibility of preserving the continuity of Jewish life and learning. Today, the AJA is probably the largest catalogued collection of documentary evidence on the history of United States Jewry in the world.
