A survey of the site of Qumran and the accompanying caves illustrated by slides will demonstrate the manner in which our understanding of Jewish history of the Second Temple period has changed as the result of these archeological discoveries. We also will focus on some of the new developments in the study of the texts that only became more readily available to the scholarly community in the 1990's and on the implications of their study for our understanding of Jewish history. The presentation will demonstrate the manner in which this evidence opens up new perspectives on the development of Judaism during this crucial, formative period in its history.

About the Speaker :

John Kampen is Academic Dean and Professor of New Testament of the Methodist Theological School in Delaware, Ohio. He has done extensive research and writing on Second Temple Judaism, especially on the Dead Sea Scrolls and the New Testament. Book titles include *The Hasideans and the Origin of Pharisaism: A Study in 1 and 2 Maccabees*, *Reading 4QMMT: New Perspectives on Qumran Law and History* with Moshe Bernstein, and *Legal Texts and Legal Issues: Proceedings of the Second Meeting of the IOQS Cambridge 1995* with Moshe Bernstein and Florentino García Martínez. Present research projects include a commentary on the wisdom texts from the Dead Sea Scrolls and a volume on social history related to the gospel of Matthew. He has also been Vice-President/Dean of Academic Affairs and Professor of Religion at Bluffton College and Professor of New Testament and Academic Dean at Payne Theological Seminary, Wilberforce, Ohio. His Ph.D. is from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion.
